

# PROCEEDINGS

The Forty-Seventh Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Edgemont, in the city of Durham, on October 11, 1933. Owing to the demise of Rev. Cyrus M. Johnson, who was chosen at the last Conference to preach the introductory sermon, Rev. J. R. Bennett, Superintendent of the Orphan Home at Middlesex, was selected for this duty. Rev. Bennett preached. Text: Gal. 6:14. "But God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" etc. His theme was, "Glorying in the cross." Prayer was offered by Rev. I. O. Hinson of the Calvary M. E. Church. Hymn "Alas and did My Saviour Bleed" was sung by the congregation.

The welcome address to the conference, extended by the city, was delivered by Rev. I. O. Hinson of the Calvary Methodist church, representing the Ministerial Association. The response to the address was by Rev. S. H. Styron of Pine Level, N. C.

The address of welcome extended by the local church was made by Rev. Henry Melvin, pastor of the same.

The benediction of the morning service was by Rev. C. R. Thrift, pastor of the Branson M. E. Church.

The local church served a splendid dinner on the church grounds at the noon hour.

## WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Conference reassembled at 1:30. The congregation sang hymn No. 17. "My Jesus, I love thee." Prayer was offered by Rev. M. E. Tyson of the Central Conference.

Rev. Henry Melvin of Durham was elected to fill the unexpired term of Rev. C. M. Johnson as moderator of the conference; Eld. J. H. Worley was also elected to fill the unexpired term of Eld. G. W. Ferrell, who is critically ill in a hospital in Raleigh at this time.

Most of the visiting brethren made short and pointed remarks, telling of the progress of the bodies they represented and as being very much delighted at being with us in the present conference.

The following brethren were chosen to serve on the Ordaining Council owing to the death of Eld. Johnson and the absence of Eld. B. B. Deans: Elds. J. H. Worley and J. A. Evans.

On motion a committee be appointed to draft suitable resolutions of respect in memory of Rev. C. M. Johnson, deceased.

The following were appointed: S. H. Styron and C. S. Hinnant.

The list of ministers was called and a large number were found to be absent, though several came on the second day that were absent on the first day.

The Devotional Committee report that Rev. R. H. Askew, a graduate student of Duke University, preach on Wednesday night, services to begin at 7:30 o'clock.

The conference at this period recognized the presence of Rev. S. C. Harrell, pastor of Main Street Christian Church.

#### REPORT OF ORDAINING COUNCIL.

The Ordaining Council report that they have examined Revs. E. R. Barnes and J. E. Taylor and find them orthodox and fit subjects otherwise for ordination, and further recommend that they be ordained at this conference.

The report of the Ordaining Council was adopted, and the ordination ordered to take place in the conference on Thursday morning at 10 o'clock.

On motion the Conference adjourn till 9:30 Thursday morning.

#### WEDNESDAY NIGHT

On Wednesday night at 7:30, the house was really packed with an overflowing crowd, who were anxious to hear Rev. R. H. Askew, a young ministerial Graduate student of Duke University. The pastor, Rev. Melvin, led in the singing of many appropriate Spiritual hymns, assisted by a splendid choir and a large audience. The minister of the occasion stated that he was not at this time a Free Will Baptist but that he was born in a Free Will Baptist home in Onslow county. He said he had traveled in different states, yet his heart was still with us. He really preached a strong F. W. B. sermon. His subject was, "Filling the gaps". Text Ezekiel 22:30. And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that I should not destroy it; but I found none." He compared the state of Israel with our own land to day. He preached a very timely sermon that was highly applauded by the large audience. He spoke of the gaps that the Lord wanted men to fill in this land to day; viz, the National gap, the gap of the homes, the domestic gap, the religious gap etc. He wonderfully emphasized how God was wanting real

men to day to fill these various gaps. A more appropriate sermon could hardly have been preached.

## THURSDAY MORNING

Conference assembled at 9:30. There was congregational singing, and instrumental music by Mrs. Jennie D. Seidell at the piano and Rev. E. R. Barnes, violinist.

## ORDINATION SERVICE

At 10 o'clock, as per former announcement, the Ordaining Council entered into the ordination services. Revs. E. R. Barnes and J. E. Taylor came forward for the sacred rite of ordination. Eld. Henry Melvin gave a very impressive charge to the candidates for ordination. Eld. S. H. Styron presented the Bible with appropriate remarks. The prayer and the laying on of the hands of the presbytery was led by the venerable J. H. Worley in which all the presbytery officiated.

At the 11 o'clock hour, Eld. S. H. Styron preached a very impressive sermon from Joshua 1:6. "Be strong and of good courage." Those who have heard Eld. Styron may be well assured that he both logically and fervently exhorted the brotherhood to be strong in the Lord and the cause of right at all times. Like the sermon on Wednesday night, his remarks were mainly upon what the times now demand strong, stalwart men who live above the fog. God told Joshua that Moses his servant was dead, thus paying to Moses the highest tribute, a tribute that any one might well crave. How we need men to day in our national life who will not yield to the will of designing politicians. Men are needed in all the walks of life, men—real men. We need them in the church, men who will not fall into the teachings of the Modernist, but who will stick to the Bible as it is and follow its teachings from the heart.

After the sermon, it was seen that all the delegates and visitors to the conference had good comfortable homes.

## RESOLUTIONS OF RESPECT FOR REV. CYRUS M. JOHNSON.

(Adopted)

Be it resolved, 1. That this Conference in the death of Cyrus M. Johnson, has lost an efficient and God fearing minister, one who filled well and impartially all duties to which he was assigned.

2. That the Free Will Baptist, as a whole, has lost one of their outstanding ministers.

3. That this conference give recognition to this great and good man here now by all ministers and delegates bowing their heads for two minutes in thanksgiving for him and in prayer for his people.

4. That these resolutions be published in the Free Will Baptist paper and a copy sent to his family.

#### REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE (Adopted).

We your committee on Sunday Schools earnestly ask that the conference adopt last year's report which is as follows:

Realizing each more fully, the increasing demand that is made on our intellectual, moral and spiritual life, for a higher order of Christian discipleship, and the need of a more adequate knowledge of God's Word in shaping our responses to the teachings of Christ, be it resolved.

1. That we place special emphasis on the importance of supporting a full time progressive Sunday School in each church throughout the conference.
2. That, so far as possible, we secure qualified teachers for each class in the school, even though we have to secure them from other trustworthy Christian brotherhoods.
3. That each superintendent avail himself of every opportunity that may be afforded him to inspire his school to its full capacity in moral, intellectual, and spiritual growth.

4. That a more constructive spirit of co-operation be encouraged among the members of each respective church, in Sunday School building.

5. That we manifest a Christian spirit and a willingness to help in the Sunday Schools of Christian brotherhoods.

6. That we use our own Sunday School literature, published at our Publishing House in the town of Ayden, N. C. as far as practicable, not excluding other literature that we may deem essential.

By the Committee.

On motion the Trustees of the Conference be given power to dispose of the Zebulon Free Will Baptist Church property as they may see best in their judgment.

On motion this conference receive M. B. Woodlief of Franklinton, N. C. as an Ordained minister of our Conference subject to his receiving a letter of dismission from the Midway Association of Ga. of which he is a member.

On motion this conference receive E. L. Hughes of 1211 East Main St. Durham, N. C. as an ordained minister of our conference subject to his receiving a letter of dismission from the conference or association of which he is a member.

## REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE

Whereas, at the last setting of our State Convention, the property of the Smithfield F. W. B. Church, was taken over by the State Convention for the purpose of utilizing said church property for the operation of a Bible School; this being done by the unanimous vote of the Convention and Whereas, we find it will be necessary to raise the sum of \$50.00 per month to take care of the indebtedness on said property and Whereas, the Western Conference, to do its part in effecting the establishment of said Bible School, therefore, be it resolved:

That we request each church to raise the small amount of \$1.00 per month and forward same each month to W. C. Willis, New Bern, N. C. who is treasurer of our North Carolina F. W. B. State Convention, who is authorized to make monthly payments.
