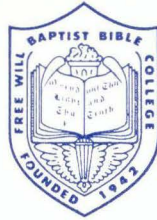

PROCEEDINGS

The Fifty-Fourth Annual Session of the Western Association of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with Tippetts Chapel Church, Wake County, North Carolina, October 16, 1940.

In the absence of Rev. J. H. Worley, Rev. C. F. Bowen conducted the devotions. The congregation sang "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name." The Rev. Mr. Bowen used as a Scripture reading the 46th Psalm. The devotional concluded with the congregation singing "Jesus is All the World to Me."

In the absence of the Moderator, Rev. J. A. Evans, the Assistant Moderator, Rev. W. A. Hales, opened the Association and spoke briefly on the obligation of the people to the Association and their relationship to each other as brethren in Christ.

By request of the Assistant Moderator the Clerk read the entire program of the Association.

The purpose of the Church Finance Corporation was verbally explained by Rev. J. A. Evans.

Rev. C. H. Coats pastor of the local church extended a cordial welcome to all the visiting delegates, ministers, and friends of the Association. Rev. W. E. Anderson responded graciously to the welcome.

Intermission from 11:15 to 11:20.

Devotions were conducted by Rev. W. R. Williams. The congregation sang "We're Marching To Zion." Prayer by Rev. J. A. Evans. Song "Jesus Is All The World To Me."

Rev. J. B. Ferrell preached the Introductory sermon, using as a subject, "The Problems of the Church." Text, Psalms 118:25.

Bro. Ferrell emphasized prosperity in the church, stating God being it's giver. God is to be taken into consideration in all phases of our business. Prayer, earnestness of purpose, learned membership, growth in grace, giving, Godly walk, were all advanced as a means of prosperity in the church, by the speaker.

After the sermon, the congregation sang, "I Need Thee Every Hour." Benediction by Rev. D. W. Hansley.

LUNCH

The Association re-convened at 1:15 P. M., with Rev. B. B. Richardson conducting the devotions. Song, "Blessed Be The Name" was sung by the congregation. Scripture, Luke 23; 33-35 was read and prayer by Rev. J. H. Worley.

"Let The Lower Lights Be Burning," was beautiful rendered by a quartette, composed of Bernard Ferrell, W. R. Williams, G. C. Joyner, Henry Melvin.

The following visiting Ministers were recognized and welcomed to the body:

Revs. C. H. Denton, R. B. Spencer, M. E. Tyson, W. L. Hart of the Central Conferences. Revs. G. C. Joyner, T. E. Beamen, C. H. Coats, C. B. Thompson, of the Cape Fear Association. Revs. L. H. Wetherington, J. R. Bennett, David Hansley, J. C. Griffin, of the Eastern Association. Rev. J. J. Hollowell of the Friends Church.

A letter from Rev. E. R. Barnes was read, expressing his desire to be present at the Association.

Since the last Association in 1939, the First Church of Durham, has been dissolved and it was moved and carried that the name of said Church be dropped from the list of Churches.

Rev. Henry Melvin made an appeal for financial help for Rev. C. F. Bowen to go to school. An offering was taken, amounting to \$8.95, and given to Bro. Bowen.

The congregation sang, "All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name."

Motion carried that we asked the Executive Committee of the State Association to investigate requirements for Ministers to enter Government service as Chaplains of the Army or Navy.

Motion carried to adjourn until Thursday morning, 9:00 A. M.

WEDNESDAY EVENING

The sermon was delivered by Rev. W. E. Anderson, using as subject, "The Steadfastness of Job," text Job 31: 2.

THURSDAY MORNING

"Revive Us Again" was sung by the congregation and Rev. C. H. Denton conducted the Devotional service. Prayer by Rev. Paul Jenkins. Song "Love Lifted Me." Scripture the first Psalm.

Motion carried that Ellwood Lane Free Will Baptist Church of Kankapolis, N. C., be admitted into the Western Association and its delegates be allowed a seat in its body.

Motion carried that Revs. Paul Jenkins and B. L. Griffin be admitted into the Western Association as ordained Ministers.

Moved and carried that the above named Ministers go before the Board of Ordination for exchange of Certificates.

A Card received by the Secretary was read, from Rev. A. R. Flowers, expressing his sincere wishes for a successful Association.

Rev. C. F. Bowen was recognized as a delegate from the State Association.

Rev. J. R. Bennett reported the condition of Rev. N. D. Wiggs as very serious and made a plea for financial aid. An offering of \$22.72 was taken and sent Bro. Wiggs. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Griffin on his behalf.

An address by Rev. R. B. Spencer on "Denominational Preparedness"

was delivered at this time. The speaker called his hearers' attention to the Biblical characters and their preparedness for their ministry. He further stated that in this modern age we are to achieve objectives through specialization. He emphasized prepared ministers and Christian workers if the Church expects to reach its objective.

"Onward Christian Soldiers" was sung by the congregation. Prayer by Rev. J. E. Taylor.

Rev. W. A. Hales delivered the Associational sermon. He used a Scripture reading, Romans 1: 1-16. His subject being, "The Power of the Gospel." He stressed the need of an uncompromising Gospel.

Mrs. Georgie Frost Barnes sang very beautifully, "There's A Rainbow In The Sky."

Rev. J. A. Evans, Superintendent of the Orphanage, reported the erection of a Dining Hall at the Orphanage was in progress. Song by the congregation, "We've A Story To Tell." An offering was received for the Orphanage and benediction by Rev. M. L. Cummings.

LUNCH

At 1:15, devotional services were conducted by Rev. M. L. Cummings. Singing by the congregation, "How Wonderful, How Marvelous."

Rev. M. E. Tyson, State Secretary of North Carolina State Association, spoke informally on the program of the State work.

Bro. C. K. Dunn, Manager of the Free Will Baptist Press, informed the Association of the condition of the Press, stating they were making slow but steady progress.

Bro. A. G. Askew gave an encouraging report of the Kenly Church in its construction of a new edifice and solicited the help of all, financially and prayerfully.

A resolution passed in the 1939 Association asking all Auxiliary societies to represent at the Association, was rescinded.

Moved and carried, the Treasurer send \$30.00 to the Treasurer of the Pittman Memorial Institute, the same to be taken from the Educational fund.

Rev. C. F. Bowen explained the working of the Pittman Memorial Institute held at Davis, N. C., each year, and insisted that the Ministers of this Association attend.

A report of the J. R. Radford Benefit Home was given by Rev. R. N. Hinnant. He stated that the Board of Trustees were hoping to erect a Home for the aged Ministers and others desiring to enter, in the near future.

Moved and carried that the Executive Board work jointly with the Board of Trustees of the above said Home, whereby plans may be worked out to raise money for the erection of said Home.

It was requested that \$5.00 as a contribution and \$25.00 for delegates expenses be set aside by the Finance Committee for the National Association.

Rev. W. L. Hart extended a cordial invitation to attend the Central Conference.

Report of Board of Ministerial Character:

We, your Committee on Ministerial Character, recommend that the name of Q. G. Worrells be erased from the list of Licentiates.

In view of the fact that R. E. Tripp has affiliated with another denomination and has so notified the local Church of which he was a member; and said local church has excommunicated him, therefore, (1) we recommend that the Ordaining Council ask for the credentials as issued to him by this body.

(2) We further recommend that the name of R. E. Tripp be removed from our ministerial roll in view of the above stated facts.
