### REPORT OF TRUSTEES (Adopted)

During the setting of the 1941 session of the Western Association the Board of Trustees was authorized to sell the Princeton F. W. B. Church. Rev. R. N. Hinnant was appointed by the trustees to negotiate and sell said property. The property was sold to the trustees of Princeton Chapel Church of Christ. Partial payment was made and the balance to be paid annually at the rate of one undred dollars until paid in full. Interest on unpaid balance is at the rate of 3 per cent until paid.

Brother Paul Jenkins stated Bro. Robert Woodard was in school in Tennessee and was unable to attend the Association.

### ROLL CALL OF CHURCHES

The Moderator declared the business period closed and asked Rev. W. A. Hales to lead the congregation in singing "Have Thine Own Way, Lord." Rev. J. H. Worley offered prayer and Rev. W. R. Williams preached the Introductory sermon. Brother Williams used as a scripture lesson Matt. 28: 16-20. The subject of the message "The Necessity of Preparation." Christ made preparation for His task and so we are called on to prepare the speaker stated. Song No. 364 "Calling the Prodigal" was sung and Rev. Paul Jenkins pronounced the benediction.

### LUNCH

At 1:30 devotions were conducted by Rev. Romie Mitchell with Rev. W. A. Hales leading the congregation in song "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Prayer was offered by Rev. T. Renfrow. Brother Mitchell read from the 12th chapter of St. John.

The Moderator appointed Rev. E. C. Morris to preach Wednesday evening and Rev. R. N. Hinnant to preach Thursday morning at 11:00 A. M.



Motion made and carried that the names of L. L. Davis and James Driver be dropped from the list of licensed ministers.

### REPORT OF EDUCATION COMMITTEE (Adopted)

Resolved that we endorse with full cooperation our National Education program. In as much as our National Association has purchased building and ground in Nashville, Tenn., which is all paid for and school work already begun we feel that our best interests will be served by giving our loyal support to it, and beg our Pastors to recommend this program to our churches and prospective students.

The scripture read from 1 Cor. 13th chapter, using the 12th verse as a text. Brother Morris used as a subject "Things Made Plain as the Years Pass by."

### THURSDAY MORNING

The Association was opened by singing "I Gave My Life for Thee." Prayer by Rev. J. C. Griffin. Rev. J. F. Parrish read from the 121st Psalm as a devotional reading.

The Moderator declared the Association open for business. He suggested that the Association have a seal made and identification cards printed for the ministers of this Association. A motion to this affect was made and the cards so arranged that they can be used by all the Conferences and Associations of the state. A committee was appointed to purchase seal and have the cards printed. The committee was composed of Rev. E. C. Morris and Rev. R. N. Hinnant. Rev. R. N. Hinnant was empowered to draw on the treasury for the payment of same.

Memorial services were held for Rev. G. W. Ferrell with Rev. J. H. Worley in charge. "Shadows" was sung as a solo by Rev. R. N. Hinnant.



A report of the Field Secretary, Rev. J. C. Griffin, was made for the State Association. He stated that our last Association, held at Malachi's Chapel was a profitable one. He also stated some of the objectives of the State Organization.
