Report of Board of Superannuation

We, the Board of Superannuation of the Western Conference report as follows:

We find, from the records of the State Board of Superannuation, that the receipts from this District for the past year were \$709.54. This is a decrease of \$31.32 under the previous year.

This amount was given as follows: Churches, \$515.32, Woman's Auxiliaries, \$22.10, Sunday Schools, \$28.07, Conference, \$25.00, Union Meetings, \$118.73.

We recommend that all of our ministers, who can qualify for the Retirement Insurance take out the full amount of \$2,000.00 now offered through the National Board of Superannuation.

We find that there are now eight (8) of our Retired Ministers who are receiving Benevolent Grants from the State Board.

The total budget called for by the State Board for this year is \$7,500.00. Of this amount the Churches of this Conference have been asked to raise \$900.00 during the month of October. We urge all of our Churches to do

their best to raise the amount suggested as their goal for the October Drive.

Temperance Committee Report

(Adopted)

RESOLVED—1st—That our leaders, including Young People and Sunday Schools, especially all teachers as well as pastors abstain from patronizing all types of and places of business that sell wine and beer in connection with their business, since selling intoxicating beverages in connection with otherwise decent items has the appearance of giving them a false decency.

2nd—That all our teaching forces be more diligent in teaching our new converts our discipline and what our church stands for, as to temperance in all matters as taught in God's Word, especially to observe the Lord's Day, and to refrain from the very appearance of all evil.

By motion, the interest accumulated from the use of the money of West Hillsboro Church be used to buy stock in the Church Finance Association, Inc.

REPORT OF BOARD OF MINISTERIAL CHARACTER

(Adopted)

We recommend that Brother T. W. Choplin, Jr's. name be dropped from our list of ordained ministers, since he has left the denomination and affiliated with another.

We recommend I. W. Jernigan be excommunicated from the list of ordained Ministers of the Western Conference, as he has departed from the faith.

We also recommend that his credentials be demanded.

Educational Committee Report

(Adopted)

Realizing that the great need of the world today is CHRIST and that the best answer to world needs is Christian teaching and living, and to get these results, there is no better way than the proper training of our children and this proper training must begin in the home therefore we urge our preachers and teachers to stress this home training around the family altar.

2nd. That we encourage our home builders to take to, and encourage our churches in all their youth activities, especially the Young peoples Leagues and Sunday Schools, by so doing we will be making available that solid ROCK upon which the world will be safe.

3rd. We are very much encouraged with the good reports coming from our Bible College and plead with our people to meet the challenge of the

college with funds to meet its needs, also that we encourage our youth and preachers to take advantage of all the College's training possible.

The Auxiliaries in North Carolina stress the 7 Point Program and support each phase of the work.

The Western Conference has asked for \$2.00 per member of every Auxiliary in the Conference to pay for repairs on girl's Dormitory at the Orphanage. Local Auxiliaries have adopted children at the Orphanage and help to clothe that child and attend to his or her needs.

The Auxiliary has also had a part in the support of Cragmont. Some of the Auxiliaries made it possible for their pastor to attend and we also purchased bed linens.

Pray for our Auxiliary work that we might accomplish more in the coming year than in the past.

Report of Board of Missions

(Adopted)

The Fremont Free Will Baptist Church has made some progress, with one addition to the Church. A Sunday School with thirty-five average attendance, also an Auxiliary with ten members.

King's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church reports eight additions to Church, and Sunday School with over fifty average attendance. Rev. Q. Hansley has been called to continue as pastor for the ensuing year.

By motion, a Committee of three be appointed to draw practical plans for financing an expansion program, within the bounds of this Conference. Committee: Paul Ketterman, Wingate Hansley, H. G. Watson.

We your Committee, beg to submit the following recommendations in regard to the extension of our Home Mission work:

No. 1—That the churches of the Western Conference of the State of North Carolina, be requested to give 4% of their regular Church offerings to the Western Conference at each regular sitting of the Conference.

No. 2—That 60% of the above amount be allocated to the Home Mission Board of the Western Conference. That the remaining 40% be allocated as the Conference should direct, to the other phases of our work.

No. 3—That the 60% stated in Recommendation No. 2 be used in support of the Expansion Program, and that this amount shall be entrusted to the hands of the Home Mission Board of the Western Conference and be allocated as they see best, through the leadership of the Spirit .

For Report of Nominating Committee, see Officers elected for 1949-50. By motion, Conference call off business for Conference sermon, to be delivered by Rev. J. B. Ferrell.

We further recommend that a copy of these resolutions be placed in the minutes of our Conference and also a copy be sent to the family.

We recommend that this Conference extend a rising vote of thanks to this church and community for the splendid and hospitable manner in which they entertained the 1949 session of the Western Conference.

Report of Board of Ordination

(Adopted)

The Board of Ordination of the Western Conference met in Wilson, March 29, 1949.

A motion was made and carried that the Chairman, Rev. Burkette Raper, secure from Rev. W. K. Jordan, his Ordination Certificate of the Free Will Baptist Church, due to the fact he has withdrawn his affiliation with our Denomination.

During the months of April and May, I contacted Brother Jordan on two occasions in Kinston, the first time at a church where he was preaching and the second time in his home. The visits were marked with friend-liness and on each occasion Brother Jordan promised to mail me his Certificate of Ordination as soon as he located it. As of date, October 10, 1949, I have not received such certificate.

We recommend as follows:

- 1-Three letters be prepared showing the annulment of his Ordination.
- 2—One copy be placed in the hands of our Brother and Minister, W. K. Jordan.
 - 3—One copy be kept in the files of the Western Conference.
- 4—One copy be placed in the hands of the printers and be published in the Free Will Baptist paper.

We the Board of Ordination recommend to the Western Conference, to ordain Bro. M. L. Tyndall upon a written official call to a Free Will Baptist Church.

By motion, Brother M. L. Tyndall be received as a Licensed Minister.
