We find, from the records of the State Board of Superannuation, that the receipts from this District for the past year were \$609.84. This is a decrease of \$113.54.

The above amount was given as follows: Churches \$469.09, Auxiliaries \$38.05, Sunday Schools \$18.99, Leagres \$3.00, Individuals \$15.00, Union Meetings \$65.71.
