We, the Board of Superannuation of the Western Conference, report as follows: We find from the records of the State Board of Superannuation, that the receipts from this District for the past year were, \$634.12. This is an increase of \$13.86 over the previous year.

The above amount was given as follows: Churches, \$520.30; Auxiliaries, \$42.37; Sunday Schools, \$34.00; Leagues, \$1.00; individuals, 50 cents; Union Meetings, \$35.95.
