#### LUNCH

#### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon session was opened by the congregation singing "Trust and Obey" led by Rev. LaRue Davis. Rev. Willie Renfrow led the devotions, reading from Judges 7:16-21.

The secretary presented the revised church discipline to the conference and it was approved and adopted by a unanimous vote.

By motion, we approve the recommendation by the State Convention in reference to our churches beginning their pastoral and fiscal year as of September first.

By motion, we adopt and approve the work of the Committee on Uniform Examination for the ordination of ministers.

By motion, we approve the proposed boundaries of the Western Conference as recommended by the Boundary Line Committee of the State Mission Board.

#### Superannuation Report

We, the Board of Superannuation of the Western Conference, report as follows:

We find from the records of the State Board of Superannuation, that the receipts from this district for the past year were \$1,211.39. This is an increase of \$142.96 over the previous year.

The above amount was given as follows: churches, \$983.91; auxiliaries, \$61.30; Sunday schools, \$79.79; leagues, \$8.00; individuals, \$15.00; union meetings, \$63.39.

We find that there are five (5) of our ministers and six (6) of our ministers' widows who are now receiving regular pension checks from the State Board of Superannuation. During the year one of our ministers who was on the superannuated list has died, namely, Rev. W. H. F. Ivey.

We urge our people to give full support to the program of the State Board of Superannuation. We ask each church to raise 25c per member as asked for by the State Board.

We also urge our active ministers, who can qualify, to carry the retirement insurance being offered through the National Board of Superannuation.
