REPORT OF MISSION BOARD OF THE WESTERN CONFERENCE

We are grateful for the way the Lord has blessed in our work during the past year. We are thankful that some of you have made it possible for us to become active. This year is the first time a mission board has had a balance in its treasury since the organizing of a mission board.

We have proposed a budget this year for \$11,103.25. (No your eyes are not deceiving you.) We are asking \$1.25 per member from each church in our conference. If each church will meet its quota, we will be able to help support the church in Greensboro and the church in Burlington. Brother George Brannan is doing a good work at the church in Greensboro.

We are happy to be able to announce to you that the mission in Burlington was organized Sunday, September 29, 1957. The church has 21 active members. They will be received into fellowship during the setting of this conference. We would like to commend Brother Garland Teasley for his untiring work in starting the mission. We believe this church to have great potentials. It is located on the main highway leading into Burlington and only one-half mile from the Western Electric plant. Let's pray for this work.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The executive committee, during the last conference year, met five different times to attend to any business pertinent to the conference.

- 6. Since this conference is the year for election of officers the moderator was requested to appoint a nominating committee for the purpose of nominating ensuing officers.
- 7. The moderator is asking all churches to comply with the recommendation on Page 18 of the 1956 minutes concerning missions. This recommendation is to be interpreted as using the money raised in this conference.

Resolution of the Western Conference of the (Original) Free Will Baptist
Denomination of North Carolina

Whereas, at a regular meeting held on January 17, 1957, the Executive Committee of the Western Conference of the (Original) Free Will Baptist Denomination of North Carolina, duly assembled after the due notice given, upon the motion of J. A. Evans, chairman of said committee, seconded by M. L. Johnson, applied and adapted the following probabilities.

Whereas, the Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, has been engaged in the erection and construction of a new church located at the corner of Granger and Barnhill Streets, Wilson, North Carolina; and whereas, it is necessary to obtain a loan in the sum of \$20,000.00 to finance the cost of construction of said church; and whereas, the trustees of said Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, have secured a committment for such loan from the clerk of the Superior Court of Wilson County, North Carolina, which said loan must be secured by a deed of trust conveying the real property of said church; and whereas, the title to said property is held by said Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, and the Western Conference of the Free Will Baptist Denomination of North Carolina; and whereas, the procedure for obtaining such loan and for the execu-

tion of such deed of trust by said Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, has been complied with according to the constitution, rules and regulations of said church; and whereas, it is necessary that the Board of Trustees of said Western Conference of the Free Will Baptist Denomination of North Carolina be authorized by the Executive Committee of such denomination to obtain such loan and to execute said deed of trust.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the unanimous vote of the Executive Committee of the Western Conference of the (Original) Free Will Baptist Denomination of North Carolina that the Board of Trustees of said Western Conference of the (Original) Free Will Baptist Denomination of North Carolina be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute all legal documents, including notes and deeds of trust, to aid the Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, to secure and obtain a loan in the sum of \$20,000.00 from the clerk of the Superior Court of Wilson County, and the said board of trustees is specifically authorized to secure said loan by creating a lien on the real property of said Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, upon which is located the church and educational building; and the said Board of Trustees of said Free Will Baptist Church of Wilson, North Carolina, in the execution of a promissorv note for \$20,000.00 with interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum secured by a deed of trust conveying the aforesaid property to Charles C. Lamm, clerk of the Superior Court of Wilson County, said note to be payable on or before two years from the date hereof.

Be it further resolved that this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this meeting.
