PROCEEDINGS OF WESTERN QUARTERLY MEETING

The Western Quarterly Meeting convened with the Valley View Church on Feb. 2, 1974, with Bobby Naill as Moderator, Bill Luallen gave a devotional from Matt. 7:7-12. Jerry Presley was in charge of opening music. Host pastor, Harry Mintz welcomes and C.G. Mulkey gives the response.
