Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF THE DECORUM

- (1) The Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- (2) There shall be no conversation by the members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- (3) Every member wishing to speak shall first rise and address the Moderator.
- (4) No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
- (5) We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother and Sister.
- (6) Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- (7) No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- (8) Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to, unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- (9) No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.
- (10) On all motions made, where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.
- (11) The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member provided the chair is filled.
- (12) Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.
- (13) Not less than nine members shall constitute a quorum.

Yadkin Valley Association of Free Will Baptists Constitution

- (1) This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by each church and sent to the Association to represent the church.
- (2) Each delegate selected by the church must be recommended by a letter from the church of which they belong. This shall include the minister pastoring the church.
- (3) Each church is required to select the best qualified members of the body to represent the church and carry on business.
- (4) The Association, when assembled, shall first elect a Moderator and Clerk.
- (5) The rules of the decorum must be read immediately after the Association is assembled.
- (6) The Association will encourage a sound ministry, such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour; that the plan of salvation, presented by Christ, is strictly and definitely Grace, and, as presented by the gospel, will save all human beings who accept it.

- (7) Any minister, in good standing with his church, or Association, may be invited to a seat in our Council and may take part in the deliberations, and his name enrolled in our minutes.
- (8) It is the duty of the Association to appoint, or elect, committees to take care of special business, etc. Each committee report must be in writing, and turned in to the Clerk for reading before the assembly.
- (9) All queries regularly presented to the Association by any Church shall be attended to.
- (10) Any church wishing to become a member of this Association may do so by making application by letter and presented by the delegates of said church. The church must adopt our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.
- (11) The Association may withdraw from any church who walks disorderly or violates any rule made and passed on by the body.
- (12) It is to be understood that the Association assumes no higher authority than that of an Advisory Council.
- (13) Any church wishing a letter of dismissal from this Association may do so on the grounds of a two-thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) majority of the members of said church.
- (14) Any minister found casting his influence against any church or, in any way, marring the character unjustly of another minister, or working in any way to secure the church of a fellow minister, will be dealt with by the Association.
- (15) This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by two-thirds ($\frac{2}{3}$) votes of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first sitting of said meeting after permanent organization.
- (16) The Ordination Council shall have authority to ordain ministers between sessions. The minister calling this council must be a member of this Association.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- (1) The Ordination Council shall act as an Advisory Council. Association of 1953.
- (2) The Ministers Conference shall have authority to elect the Ordination Council. Association of 1954.

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

The second annual session of the Yadkin Valley Association of (Original) Free Will Baptists convened with Long's Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Union County, September 3, 1954, at 10 o'clock A. M. Song entitled, "I Feel Like Traveling On," was sung. Rev. L. M. Hooper read a scripture for devotion, which was taken from Rev. 21, after which Rev. William Johnson led the Association to God in prayer.

Rev. William Johnson, pastor of the host church, extended a most cordial welcome to the Association.

Rev. L. M. Hooper, Moderator, declared the house in order for business and called for nominations for the various Associational officers. These officers were elected or re-elected: Rev. L. M. Hooper, Moderator; Rev. William Johnson, Vice-Moderator; Rev. J. P. Langley, Clerk; and Brother William D. House, Treasurer. Bro. House was also elected to be assistant to the Clerk.

Two (2) trustees were elected to fill the vacated offices of Rev. E. G. Lawing and Bro. R. O. Gales. These two trustees will be Rev. L. M. Hooper and Rev. J. P. Langley. Bro. C. E. Bauknight was elected president of the Sunday School and Singing Convention. Bro. William D. House was elected as vice-president and Mrs. Ruth Burnett was elected as secretary and treasurer.

At the hour of worship, Rev. S. A. Graybeal brought a wonderful message from Luke 9:28-36, using as his subject: "A Mountain Top Experience."

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Friday afternoon the body assembled again for business.

Upon motion, the Association granted the Minister's Conference the authority to elect the Ordination Council.

The Moderator asked Rev. J. P. Langley to speak a few words on "Life In An Orphanage," since Rev. Langley lived several years in an orphanage. Rev. Langley brought out the point: "The Church which neglects offerings for the orphanage so that it might pay the pastor, will soon have no need of a pastor."

Many interesting talks were made for the encouragement of the Ladies' Auxiliary and the support of the orphanage.

Conference adjourns until 10 o'clock Saturday morning.

Friday evening at 7:30 an hour of worship was enjoyed. Rev. J. P. Langley brought an interesting message from Judges 7:21, using as his text, "And Every Man Stood In His Place."

Saturday Morning Session

Conference convened Saturday morning to resume business. Song entitled, "I'm Going That Way," was sung and the Moderator read a scripture which was taken from the tenth chapter of Hebrews. Bro. L. C. Leary led the body in prayer.

The Association gave time out for the ministers to pass a motion that the Annual Ministers' Conference meet on Saturday, six (6) days before the sitting of the Annual Association. The Annual Association convenes on Friday before the first Sunday in September.

The annual Minister's Conference of the Yadkin Valley Association of Free Will Baptists convened September 2, 1954, at 10 o'clock A. M. at Long Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Monroe, N. C., with Rev. H. E. Tucker in the chair as moderator. Song entitled, "I Am Thine, O Lord," was sung and the conference was led in prayer by Rev. S. A. Graybeal. Rev. L. M. Hooper read the scripture which was taken from Rom. 8:1-9.

Officers for the incoming conference year were elected as follows: Moderator, Rev. H. E. Tucker; Vice-Moderator, Rev. Boyce Calolway; Clerk, Rev. J. P. Langley; Assistant Clerk and Treasurer, Rev. Mack Crisp.

Body moves to ask authority of the Association to elect its Ordination Council. This council to consist of the following ministers: Rev. L. M. Hooper, chairman; Rev. J. P. Langley, clerk; Rev. S. A. Graybeal, Rev. G. W. Liner, and Rev. Boyce Calloway.

Body moves to elect a committee to draw up some form of rules for accepting ministers, both licensed and ordained, into this Association. This committee to consist of the following: Rev. J. P. Langley, Rev. William Johnson and Rev. S. A. Graybeal.

Body moves to withdraw fellowship from Rev. L. D. Gray and Rev. E. G. Lawing, and for the clerk to write and request of them the return of their credentials.

The committee on "Rules and Regulations for Applicants for Credentials" recommended the following:

- (1) No minister may be granted licenses or certificate of ordination by the Ordination Council unless he presents a letter of recommendation from the church to which he belongs. Also, this church must be a member of this Association.
- (2) No licensed minister may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license.
- (3) No licensed minister, even though he may be called as an assistant pastor, may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license.

- (4) The Ordination Council must not use partiality in the issuance of credentials.
- (5) All ministers being admitted to this Association must promise to relinquish their credentials if and when he joins another Association, or when he is adjudged by the ministers' conference to be disqualified to preach the gospel.
- (6) These rules must be read to each minister asking for entrance into Association.

Next Minister's Conference to meet on first Saturday in December, 1954, at 10 A.M. at Arrington Heights Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington, N. C. Adjournment. Dismissed by Bro. William D. House.
