

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will, everywhere, hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and the evangelistic effort for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

RULES OF THE DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be opened and closed with praver.
- 2. There shall be no conversation by the members one with another so as to interrupt business while in session.
- 3. Every member wishing to speak shall first rise and address the Moderator.
- 4. No member shall interrupt a member while speaking.
- 5. We shall admit no other title while in session but that of Brother and Sister.
- 6. Every member speaking shall attend to the subject under consideration.
- 7. No member shall speak more than twice on any one subject.
- 8. Every motion made and seconded shall be attended to, unless withdrawn by the person who made it.
- 9. No member shall absent himself from the body without leave of the Moderator.
- 10. On all motions made, where the vote of the body is taken, a majority shall prevail.
- 11. The Moderator shall have the same privilege to speak as any other member, provided the chair is filled.
- 12. Any member transgressing the above rules shall be admonished by the Moderator.
- 13. Not less than eight members shall constitute a quorum.

YADKIN VALLEY ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

- 1. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected by each church; three for the first fifty members or fraction thereof, and one for each additional fifty members or fraction thereof sent to the Association to represent the church.
- 2. Each c hurch is required to select the best qualified members of the body to represent the church and carry on business.
- 3. The Association, when assembled, shall first elect a Moderator and Clerk.
- 4. The Rules of the Decorum must be read immediately after the Association is assembled.
- 5. Any minister, in good standing with his church, or Association, may be invited to a seat in our Council and may take part in the deliberations, and his name enrolled in our minutes.
- 6. It is the duty of the Association to appoint, or elect committees to take care of special business, etc. Each committee report must be in writing, and turned into the Clerk for reading before the assembly.

- 7. All queries regularly presented to the Association by any Church shall be attended to.
- 8. Any Church wishing to become a member of this Association may do so by making application by letter and represented by the delegates of said Church. The Church must adopt our Articles of Faith and Church Covenant.
- 9. The Association may withdraw from any church who walks disorderly or violates any rule made and passed on by the body.
- 10. It is understood that the Association assumes no higher authority than that of an Advisory Council.
- 11. Any church wishing a letter of dismissal from this Association may do so on the grounds of a two-thirds majority of the members of said church.
- 12. Any minister found casting his influence against any church or, in any way, marring the character unjustly of another minister, or working in any way to secure the church of a fellow minister, will be dealt with by the Association.
- 13. This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by two-thirds vote of the delegates attending, providing that a notice of such change shall have been given during the first sitting of said meeting after permanent organization.
- 14. The Ordaining Council shall have authority to ordain Pastors of churches entering this Association between Sessions.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserve, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and . in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His Divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior andLord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by dis-

obedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentence or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunction of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who would comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men becomes His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who though grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testaments; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2a).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They have done good will, come forth to the resurrection of life and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

- 1. The Ministers' Conference shall have authority to elect the Ordaining Council. (Association of 1954).
- 2. All Ministers of this Association, licensed and ordained, shall have a seat, voice and vote at all Ministers' Conferences, and, along with all delegates, at Associational Conferences. (Amended thus Association 1966).
- 3. Any Minister failing to send in a report or dues to this Association shall subject his name to be placed on the Nominal Roll of Ministers. (Association of 1978).
- 4. The Annual Association shall begin with a Worship Service on Friday Night at 7:30 P. M. and the Business Session will be conducted on Saturday Morning to begin at 10:00 A. M. (Association of 1978)

RULES GOVERNING ORDAINING COUNCIL

- 1. No minister may be granted license or certificate or ordination unless he presents a letter of recommendation from the church to which he belongs. Also, this church must be a member of this Association.
- 2. No licensed minister may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license unless he is called to be full-time pastor of a church.
- 3. No licensed minister, even though called to be assistant pastor, may be ordained under one (1) year from date of issuance of Associational license.
- 4. All ministers being admitted to this Association must promise to relinquish the credentials they hold from this Association if, and when, he joins another Association, or when he is adjudged by the Ministers' Conference to be disqualified to preach the gospel.
- 5. All Ministers entering this Association. from another Free Will Baptist Association must present a letter of recommendation from the Association he is leaving. Also he must surrender the credentials he holds from the Association he is leaving.
- 6. The Ordaining Council shall not have the authority to license women to preach.
- 7. This Council shall not issue credentials to brethren who have two (2) living companions, even though divorced.
- 8. These rules must be read to each minister asking for entrance into this Association.

9. All ministers will be ordained for a two year period. His ordination certificate will expire automatically at the annual association two years following his latest ordaining. His credentials will be automatically renewed if he has supported the association and Ministers' Conferences, and if his life and works have proved that he is qualified to continue to preach the gospel. If he has questionable qualifications, he must be dealt with by the Ordaining Council and they will have the authority to either renew or reject his credentials. (Adopted Association, 1979)

YADKIN VALLEY ASSOCIATION

The Annual Ministers' Conference met with Near Calvary F.W.B. Church, September 1, 1979. Host Pastor Rev. Junior Ballew opened the service with a congregational song entitled, Amazing Grace. Rev. Raeford James read the Scripture from Psalm 27, after which an Altar Prayer was enjoyed together.

The Service was then turned over to Moderator Rev. Wayne Hart, Roll Call was made by Rev. Alfred Absher with eight (8) Ministers answering their name: Reverends, Alfred Absher, Junior Ballew, Grover Bare, Kenneth Deal, Wayne Hart, W. W. Howard, Raeford James, and Johnny Triplette. Rules of Decorum were read by Rev. James.

Meeting was called to order for Business by Moderator with the election of Ministers Conference Officers first in order. Moderator – Rev. Wayne Hart. Vice Moderator – Rev. Junior Ballew. Clerk and Treasurer – Rev. Kenneth Deal. Assistant Clerk – Rev. W. W. Howard. The Ordination Council was elected as follows – Rev. Kenneth Deal, Chairman, Rev. Alfred Absher, Rev. Junior Ballew,, Rev. Johnny Triplette, Rev. W. W. Howard.

No old business was discussed. New business, the next Ministers' Conference is to meet with Long Shoals F.W.B. Church with Host Pastor Rev. Wayne Hart. Rev. Johnny Triplette gave in a testimony and received offering of \$11.28 and gave to Treasurer. Conference then dismissed for 5 minutes.

WORSHIP SERVICE

Opened with Congregation Song entitled: Glory to His Name. Rev. Grover Bare brought a wonderful message from St. John, 14: 1-4. After which Rev. W. W. Howard ordination was filled out and given to him.

FRIDAY EVENING SESSION

September 7, 1979

The Twenty-seventh Annual Association opened at 7:00 P. M. at Arrington Heights Free Will Baptist Church in Lexington, N. C. The Association had been scheduled to meet at Northview Church in Statesville, N. C. but due to Northview Church withdrawing from the Yadkin Valley Association, the meetings were re-scheduled to Arrington Heights.

Two songs were sung by the congregation entitled, "Come Unto Me" and "My Name Is Written There." An altar prayer was led by Rev. Junior Ballew, after which Rev. Kenneth Deal, Pastor extended a welcome to all.

Special singing was provided by Leigh Ann Miller, Bonnie and Angie Deal, and the Near Calvary Singers.

Rev. Guy Owens, the N. C. State Association Minister-at-Large brought an inspiring message from St. John, Chapter 2, using for his text: "Whatsoever He tells you to do, do it."

After the message was delivered, Rev. Owens presented a program of showing slides of different churches in the Yadkin Valley Association.

The body was then dismissed by Bro. Danny Wilson.

Ministers present for this session were: Reverends Kenneth Deal, Junior Ballew, Raeford James, and Willard Howard.

SATURDAY MORNING SESSION

September 8, 1979

The song, "I'll Fly Away" opened the Saturday morning session, followed by an altar prayer, led by Rev. Wayne Hart.

Rev. Kenneth Deal extended a welcome and read the Scripture from St. Luke 9:23-26, then the meeting was turned over to the Moderator, Rev. Alfred Absher.

The Rules of the Decorum and Roll Call was made by Rev. Kenneth Deal.

The officers of the Association were elected:

Rev. Hubert Bennett, a visiting minister was given a voice and a seat in our deliberations.

Long Shoals Free Will Baptist Church at Long Shoals, N. C. was accepted into the Association. Rev. Wayne Hart is Pastor of this great church.

All reports that had been received by the clerk were read, after which the various committees were appointed by the Moderator. (These reports are found elsewhere in these minutes).

The Ordaining Council met with Bro. Rodney Cashatt who had been recommended for liscensing by the Association.

While the Ordaining Council was meeting, the clerk read the Original Minutes of the very first meeting of the Yadkin Valley Association when it was first organized in 1952.

The Ordaining Council recommended Bro. Rodney Cashatt be accepted into the Association as a licensed minister. It was voted on, and he was accepted and given the right hand of fellowship, after which we adjourned for lunch.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

We immediately entered into business by discussing that all ordained ministers' (except retired) Ordaination Certificates be renewed every two years, due to the unfaithfulness of several of our ministers. After much discussion, this was voted on and passed. The clerks of the Ministers' Conference and Association are to study the certificates and present recommended changes to the Ministers' Conference which meets in December, 1979 for approval. All Committee Reports were read.

It was voted that since the Yadkin Valley Association had not contributed to the state work during the past year, that the treasurer send a check for \$120.00 to Rev. Guy Owens. Also, he is to send \$10.00 per month. All churches are asked to take an offering on the first Sunday of each month and send it to the clerk for this purpose.

The next annual session will meet in 1980 at the Long Shoals F.W.B. Church in Long Shoals, N. C.

We were then dismissed by Rev. Rodney Cashatt.

COMMITTEE REPORTS FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

1. That each church send one dollar (\$1.00) per member, annually to this Association.

2. That each Sunday School send fifty-cents (.50) per member. annually to this Association.

3. That each Minister send twelve dollars (\$12.00) annually to this Association. In addition to this, we recommend that each pastor receive a free will offering on the last Sunday before the Annual Association.

4. That each Church receive a free will offering on the first Sunday of each month, send it to the Clerk of the Association, to be deposited in the Savings Account.

5. That the Association pay the clerk/treasurer fifty dollars (\$50.00) per year for his or her services.

6. If the Executive Committee is called to a church, said church shall pay the traveling expenses of the members of the Committee.
