REPORT OF OBITUARY COMMITTEE

We, the Committee on Obituary, report the following: Sister Norma Baley, William H. Bowen, and other more complete records have been handed in, which are as follows:

We regret to report the departure of one of our oldest and most beloved ministers, Eld. C. M. Church, who was born at Nago, Arkansas December 24, 1879, and departed this life at his home in Ft. Smith, Ark., April 5, 1947. Funeral was conducted at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Ft. Smith, Ark. April 8, 1947, by Rev. Ben Pixley. Burial was at Nogo, Ark. He was 67 years of age. He was converted at the age of 23, and began his ministry at the age of 40.

Bro. Church was a member of the Cottonwood Free Will Baptist Church at the time of his death, but in the past had been a member of different churches in the Association. He was an active minister in this Ass'n, also in the Robert McGee, Eureka and Eastern Okla. Associations. He was influential, lived a clean life, wielded a great influence and was a great warrior for his Chief and Commander, the Lord Jesus Christ. He is now missing in action, but we'll meet him on the other shore, where we'll celebrate the victory through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Sister Anna Laura Dipboye was born December 24, 1875, and departed this life November 27, 1946, at the age of 70 years. She gave her heart to God in early womanhood. She loved the cause of Christ; and, although she was not a member of the Free Will Baptist Church, she attended it for the last few years, and supported it. She has two sons who are ministers in this Association, and one daughter who is a Methodist minister's wife. She was the mother of eight living children, and often said that she believed they would all finally be saved.

Funeral service was conducted on November 29, 1946, by Eld. Ben Pixley and Eld. Charles Graham, at the First Free Will Baptist Church in Ft. Smith, Ark.

T. L. Crabtree of the Catcher community, near Vanburen, Ark., departed this life July 22, 1947. At the age of 54 he was the father of eleven children, was converted and united with the Catcher Free Will Baptist Church in July, 1945, and was a true member of the Catcher Church at the time of his death. He was a good neighbor and a man of God, loved by those that knew him. Since his conversion was a great influence for the cause of his Redeemer, he will be greatly missed by the church and community, but our loss is heaven's gain.

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RULES OF ORDINATION

- 1. Do you believe in the Total Depravity of the human heart? Answer—No.
- 2. Do you believe that infants are saved while in a state of innocence? Answer—I Do.
- 3. Do you believe in a Full and Free Salvation to all who will accept it on the Gospel terms? Answer—I Do.
- 4. Do you believe in a burial of a believer in Christ with water after he has been baptized into Christ by the Holy Ghost is the only baptism? Answer—I Do.
- 5. Do you believe that any man has a right in the Gospel to Repeat Baptism to such a subject? Answer—No.
- 6. Do you believe that Communion, Feet Washing and Baptism are Gospel Ordinances and are to be taught and practiced until He comes again? Answer—I Do.
- 7. Will you solemnly pledge yourself to preach and practice; the same God being your helper? Answer—I will by the help of God.
- 8. Do you believe that none will be finally saved but those who persevere in Holiness to the end? Answer—I Do.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomsoever he may request.
- 2. Ministers present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.
- 3. Those who speak shall arise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
 - 4. No motion shall be discussed without a second.
 - 5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a mem-

ber opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall be dismissed.

- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.
- 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all members present.
- 10. No member shall absent himself without special leave of the Moderator.
- 11. Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected before the close of the Association, if necessary.
 - 12. At all future sessions of the Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two sermons, or other devotional exercises equivalent thereto, during each day of the session, and the chair shall announce just before adjournment who shall fill the stand at the next meeting.
 - 13. These Rules of Order shall be distinctly read from the chair immediately after organization of the Association.
 - 14. Alterations may be made in these rules at any regular session of the Association.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in one true and living God, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, and these three are equal in Divine essence, power and glory—Romans 1:20; 1st John 1:7; John 17:21.
- 2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written and revealed Word of God, and the only infallible rule of faith and practice—Matt. 5.18; 2 Tim. 3:16.
- 3. We believe that God created man good and gave him holy commandments whereby he should live holy, but man voluntarily disobeyed the commandments of God, transgressed the law and fell under the just condemnation of the same whereby all mankind are sinners; not by constraint, but by choice; being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the fall, and that man is unable to save himself, with his own power, but we see Jesus for the suffering of death crowned with glory, that He, by the Grace of God, should taste death for every man—Gen. 3:7-17; Heb. 2:9.

4. We believe that Christ, by His death, burial and resurrection, purchased our pardon and offered it freely to all manhind upon the principles of repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. He now commands all men everywhere to repent, therefore He saith: "Look unto me and be saved all ye ends of the earth, for I am God, and there is none else"—Matt. 4:17; Isaiah 45:22; Acts 20:2-21; Acts 17:30.

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- 5. We believe that adult persons must be regenerated and born of the Spirit of God if they inherit eternal life—John 3:3.
- 6. We believe that infants and idiots are saved by the merits of the Son of God-John 4:11; Deut. 1:39; Mk. 10:14; Lk. 18:16.
- 7. We believe that all Christians should persevere in grace and be faithful to the end if they inherit eternal life; for blessed are they that do His commandments that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates of the city—Matt. 24:13; Rev. 22:14.
- 8. We believe that Baptism by immersion is the Apostolic mode, even the burial of the believer in water; and that Christ, who is our life, showed this humble example to His children, and bids us walk therein—John 3:22; Matt. 3:16; 28:19-20; Romans 6:2-5.

We believe that God in His goodness displays His power of grace in a great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by the teaching of the Holy Ghost, and by the instructions of His blessed Word, to go forth and proclaim life and salvation He bids us freely to come, and nothing prevents the salvation of any but their own stubborn rebellion and sinful refusal to come—1. Cor. 12:13; Eph. 3:7; Rev. 22:17; Isa. 55:1.
- 10. We believe that Baptism and the Lord's Supper and Washing the Saint's feet are Divine ordinances and should be observed by all His children—Mk. 14:22; John 13:4-14; Matt. 28:19-20; 1 Tim. 5:10.
- 11. We believe that none have a right to Baptism only those who have obtained a living hope in the Lord Jesus Christ, and none have the right to administer the same only those who are called of God, have come under the hands of the Presbytery of Elders; and each church ought to have a Pastor, Deacons and Clerk, chosen by the church and continue in office during the good pleasure of the same; and in dealing with disorderly members, reference should be had to the 18th chapter of Matthew and other Scriptures relative to dealing with disorderly members. In all cases a majority shall rule, except in receiving

members, which shall be unanimous—Tit. 1:5; Acts 14.23; 2 Cor. 6:6.

- 12. We believe it to be the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month and that it is the duty of the Pastor of the church when setting forth the Lord's Supper to "let a man examine himself, and so let him eat"—1 Cor. 11:28; John 13:14; Heb. 10:25.
- 13. We believe that Sanctification and Holiness is a Bible doctrine, that immortality is God dwelling in the light so when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to be singly engaged to promote the honor and glory of God—Gal. 6:10; 1 John 2:9.
- 14. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, of both the just and the unjust. The resurrection of the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God, the unjust, to everlasting shame and banishment from the presence of God--Mt. 25:31-34; 1 Cor. 15:42-45; 2 Thess. 1:4-11; Rev. 20:12-15.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be dong on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
