



## Twenty-fifth Anniversary at Joplin

The First Free Will Baptist Church of Joplin, Missouri, will be celebrating its 25th anniversary on Sunday, June 11, 1978. The special day will begin with Sunday school at 9:45. Plans are being made to break the previous record of 202 in attendance. The morning worship will include special music, and proper recognition will be given the anniversary event. The church was organized on January 15, 1953, with a charter membership of eighteen. The church petitioned the Indian Creek Association for membership in September of that year and was received into fellowship of the association. This placed the church in fellowship with the Missouri State Association and the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

The church moved to its present location, 2301 Connecticut, and constructed a beautiful church edifice and parsonage. In August of this year all bonds will mature and the church indebtedness will be paid.



Left to right: Trustees: Olon Lincoln, John Miller, Leroy Huff Background: Rev. Guy Leonard




Parkview Free Will Baptist Church

Children's Church is a gift from God. Our church was the first in Farmington to have an effective and interesting children's church program.

At present we have four graded children's church programs. They are three and four year old, kindergarten and first grade, second and third grade, and fourth, fifth, and sixth grades.

The bus ministry has contributed to the children's church program. It is a necessity for a church with a bus ministry. The children cannot be turned loose in the church sanctuary for the worship service without parental guidance.

By the time our children are old enough to enter adult church, they know how to behave. However, they are in the adult services on Sunday evening from age three and up. The children's church program carries over to music and devotions on Wednesday evenings for the prayer meeting service.

The program for the children varies from week to week. There is storytelling, flannelgraph, preaching, and always singing and prayer. The children enjoy it, and they learn much more than they would in an adult service. Also, this results in a peaceful and quiet atmosphere that is conducive for worship in the auditorium. The adults appreciate the children's church.

Pastors, children's church and the bus ministry will produce converts, baptisms, new members, maturity in new Christians, and growth for the church and Sunday school. This will occur in the children and the adult departments.

#### Attention: Clerks, District Association

This item was adopted at the Missouri State Association last year: "That each district association pay a representation fee to the Missouri State Association of \$5.00 per church and this fee to become a part of the procedure of seating the delegates. The motion was made and seconded to amend that this money will be used to pay for expenses of the Missouri State Association and the printing of minutes."






