I want us to send a missionary to New England this year! I am praying and looking for a qualified man to present to our Board for approval in its May meeting.

If we had some funds in a New England account, it would help secure a man to send and then shorten the time needed to get him to the field.

Will you make a gift today to a *New England account* and help us get a man to this needy field this year? Experience has shown that men have applied for areas where there is money in an account.

Points for Pastors

How do you promote a revival meeting? This is obviously a problem, and maybe a mystery, because so often an evangelist goes into a church for services and discovers that no one knows about the meeting.

I have discovered that a meeting can be promoted to the extent everyone in the church, and most of the community, knows about the revival.

First, start weeks in advance announcing the meeting in the services of the church. Build the image of the evangelist in the minds of the congregation. Set up prayer meetings, cottage prayer meetings, and have written prayer lists of those you will pray for during this time of revival. Unsaved, backsliders, various departments of the church, such as Sunday school, bus ministry, deacons, pastor, evangelists, sick, children's churches, as well as school and community needs should be included in the list. This is all a part of revival promotion.

Second, newspaper ads, as well as radio spot announcements, are good. Have teens and others who are qualified make unusual posters for both church bulletin boards and business places. Hand out handbills door to door and put them on automobiles in shopping centers.

Third, have your visitation teams go door to door telling about the revival and finding prospects. As you gather prospects, send teams out to visit them and urge them to attend. Witnessing for Christ in a soul-winning venture should not be neglected during this time. Many people could be saved before revival time begins, and a spirit of revival will probably be active in the church days before the evangelist arrives.

Promote your meeting. Get the people excited about the meeting. Be ready when revival time comes.

Essentials of Evangelism

by Stanley Jones

In these articles dealing with evangelism I have tried to use terms common to all. Some people may have definitions for some of these terms that are different from mine. So there will be no misunderstanding, I would like to give the definitions to some of these terms as I have used them.

REVIVAL—The recovery of a consciousness of God and a renewed performance of Biblical holiness in the lives of professing Christians.

EVANGELISM—The art of instructing sinners in the gospel of Jesus Christ with conversion as the aim.

SAVED—The present condition of one who is exercising faith in the finished work of redemption through Christ. One who is rescued from the penalty and practice of sin.

LOST—The present condition of one who has not repented of his sins and is not trusting Christ as Lord and Savior.

BACKSLIDER—One whose first love for Christ has diminished.

REDEDICATION—The reaffirmation of a previous commitment to Christ which has been left unfulfilled.

CONVICTION—A consciousness of one's sins and an awareness of one's hopeless condition without Christ.

FOLLOW-UP—The deliberate effort to aid the Christian growth of new converts.

REVIVAL PLANNING—The alignment with God's organized principles of revival by which God can effectively work through His people.

CHURCH-WIDE REVIVAL—The combination of both revival and evangelism in and through the local church.




