

from the Editor

On May 11, the Epiphany Community Unitarian Universalist Church of Fenton, Michigan, featured a Zen Buddhist with a Christian background to be the preacher that day "so that we can experience the similarities of our faith paths," according to Anne Lerche pastor.

That story on the Religion News Service caught my eye. The article that followed listed several other churches around the country that would be celebrating Pluralism Sunday. That's a day sponsored by The Center for Progressive Christianity, a network of over 5000 affiliates and nearly 400 churches nationwide which have adopted a "Welcome Statement" that affirms that other religions can be as good for their followers as Christianity is for Christians. Churches in Australia, New Zealand and Britain also participated in Pluralism Sunday. "We do not claim that our religion is superior to all others. Instead, we celebrate that we can grow closer to God and grow deeper in compassion, and we can understand our own traditions better, through a deeper awareness of the world's religions," says Rev. Jim Burklo, the event's national coordinator.

Huh? As I visited the website for the Center for Progressive Christianity I discovered they offered a wealth of resources if I should choose to participate in their noble cause. Sermon topics like "Living Buddha, Living Christ," "Jesus and Mohammed," and the classic sounding "Hinduism and Christianity, A Fine Balance," (although disappointingly the link to that one was not working.) There were several websites full of worship resources and even some for

children. These were all directed toward helping us understand that our "religion is not superior to all others." Now I don't have a bit of trouble doubting that statement is true of both Mr. Burklo and all the other contributors to his website and even all those churches who celebrated Pluralism Sunday. In fact, their religion sounds like it is not superior to anything. In reading one of the above mentioned sermons I found this jewel . "Jesus said, "I and the Father are one." A Japanese Zen master said, "The Buddha and all sentient beings are not two." Thich Nhat Hanh said, "Buddhism is made of non-Buddhist elements. Buddhism has no separate self. When you are truly a happy Christian, you are also a Buddhist. And vice versa. I guess that would make all Buddhists "truly happy Christians?"

Please excuse my rant. This kind of stuff just makes me angry. When Jim Burklo, director of the Center for Progressive Christianity says that his religion is not superior to any other, he is speaking the truth. Religion covers a broad territory and can be a belief in anything. But later in his blather when he says that Christianity is not superior, I take exception. The world is full of religions, all teaching that they can take you to come kind of higher existence or enlightenment. They all promise they are the pathway to god, whomever or whatever he might be. Yet, there is only one belief system that is based on a person rather than a teaching. Others may promise to show you a way to eternity, Christ leads you there.

A uniqueness of Christianity is that Jesus is radically different than Buddha or Mohammed or




Joseph Smith. He is the only one who said/says He was/is God and proved/proves it. He is the only one who died on a cross for the sins of the world and rose from the dead three day later. He is the only one who ascended to the Father in heaven and is coming back again for his faithful. All the others are still dead in the grave. They are nothing but bones now while Jesus is alive and well and coming again. For years Satan has stirred men to look for ways to discredit Him. From denials of His death and resurrection to the assertion that He was married and had children, men have sought to destroy God's claim on them. 
Missouri Show-Me Missions



Blessed be the Co-Workers, for They Shall Lighten the Load

When Brenda and I first began a ministry in the interior of Panama in 1986 we were basically alone as North Americans in the church planting ministry. Our first eighteen months were spent in the Las Tablas FWB Church. During that time we would travel to the small town of Parita and meet with a small group of believers. In the fall of 1987 we moved to Chitre, and began working full time in Parita with the goal of installing a national pastor as soon as possible. That goal would take several years to realize.

Once a pastor was installed in Parita we were free to begin a ministry in Chitre which was our goal since the beginning. We had

worked in various social and Christian outreaches in our neighborhood since we moved there. Stan was president of the "Sewer Committee". Not a very glamorous job but one that gave us contact with city officials and a good relationship and trust with all of our neighbors. The Good News Bible Club gave us

contact with the children in the area as well as their parents. Many of our teen leaders presently, were small children when we started the Bible Club. Several of our adult leaders are parents who were saved as a result of the ministry to their children. Such contacts which were made prior to the official beginning of the Good News FWB Church in Chitre have proven extremely valuable.

During those first 20 years we were pretty much on our own as missionaries in the interior. When we started the Good News Church, the congregation was a handful of inexperienced and new Christians. Every thing that was done was our responsibility. We quickly began to appoint people to take over certain aspects of the ministry.

In 2006, Steve and Lori Torrison came to minister in Panama. All new missionaries in Panama must

work alongside another missionary couple, at least during their first term of service. Steve plays the guitar for our services. He and Lori also teach and work with the youth, lead a cell group and are developing youth leaders to replace them. Both are involved in the men's and ladies groups of the church and have an extremely vital ministry.

For two decades Brenda and I worked alone as a church planting missionary couple. Now, for the last two years we have worked with another missionary couple who have come alongside us and use their gifts and talents in the church planting ministry. Having another couple with musical and youth leadership abilities has proven to be a huge asset to the ministry. As we look toward future church planting ministries in Panama we will most definitely want to give priority to the possibility of sending out teams of missionaries.

As a team in Chitre, we meet regularly to plan, pray and discuss the ministry. There is mutual encouragement, correction and challenges that take place. All of us are working to develop national leadership that will serve as our replacements in the future.

After having served as 'solo' missionaries for several years and now, after having had the privilege of working in tandem with another missionary couple I can say, "Blessed are the co-workers, for they shall lighten the load."

Thank you for your prayers and support for the ministry in Panama.

In this mainly agricultural country the city of Montevideo stands as a shining port on the South Atlantic Ocean which holds half of the population of that country. But even in the "big city" the laid back, time-takes-care-of-itself Uruguayan attitude is prevalent. Another dominant mindset among these good people is to be "non-religious" or Atheists. Over one-third of them have this very dangerous view of eternal life. Most of those who do not share that view claim to be Roman Catholic but very few of those make that religion a regular part of their lives.

This awareness has caused our current FWB missionaries Molly Barker and Jamie & Tammie Lancaster to cry out for God to send more workers into this vast and ripe field. The prayer has been for the Truth to be sent into the large capitol city of Montevideo so that God could not only let the Truth be spread, but that the false teachings of the Mormons and Muslims would not get a foot hold in the minds of the people. The last few days of April of this year began the answer to those prayers. Two couples among the eight new appointees have been given Career Missionary status by our International Missions Department in Nashville and they were directed to take the Gospel to the city of Montevideo.

One of those couples that are being sent to Montevideo, Uruguay is David & Kendra Dodson who recently have been ministering in the Calvary Fellowship church in Fenton, MO. David is the son of Ken & Paula Dodson who are currently pastoring in Monett, MO and Kendra comes to us from the state of Tennessee. They, as well as, their 2 yr-old son Deacon, are starting their deputation period and are looking for prayerful and financial support to get them to Uruguay as soon as possible.

On Saturday, March 22, more than 1,000 people gathered in the professional soccer stadium in Bondoukou to celebrate 50 years of God's blessing. A specially-appointed committee planned the event which included a time of singing and worship, a historical overview, a message from retiring missionary Jerry Pinkerton, and special recognitions.

Several hundred worshippers formed a procession from the city center to the stadium. Many were adorned in outfits made from the commemorative cloth designed specifically for the "Cinquante-tenaire" (50th Anniversary).

The celebration was attended by several dignitaries including the regional governor and local mayor. A special tent was set up for current and former missionaries as well as Free Will Baptist pastors. Another tent was designated for elders and special guests.

The national church expressed great appreciation to the missionaries who have served in the country and prepared a special framed certificate for every current and former missionary. Free Will Baptist International Missions also honored missionaries as well as ordained and licensed pastors.

According to Director of Field Operations Steve Lytle, "The event was moving, well organized, and beautifully hosted. It was a tribute to the faithfulness of our pioneer and current missionaries. And, it provided a wonderful affirmation of the capability of our national leadership."






Easter at Lingo



The Bivens Report



Morelos, Coahuila, Mexico. April 16th Missionary Bud Bivens and pastor "Danny Phillips, Airport FWB Church in Tulsa, finished their 3rd annual Walk-a-thon. The good friends completed the 100K walk in three days walking in and around the city of Morelos. As they walked Bivens said they "solved the problems of the world and met some very interesting people. "

The purpose of this hike is to raise operational funds for the IBLAC Bible Institute in Altamira and the Getsemani Children's Home in Morelos. Donations and pledges for the walk will be split 50/50 between the two ministries. Bud and his wife Ruth, lay missionaries, have been back in Mexico for nearly three years. They previously served under National Home Missions for three years at the Seminary of the Cross in

Reynosa, five years in Puerto Rico, and then three years under the MO State Mission Board establishing a Hispanic work in Monett MO.

Leaving that work in the capable hands of one of their former students Bro. Fermin Sanchez, they retired and returned to Mexico at the request of the local pastors, supported by a Government Grant called Social Security. They raised funds and enabled the re-opening of the Bible Institute which had been closed in '96 when the Seminary opened in Reynosa. The students are finishing their 4th semester. The Bivens are frequently on the road raising money for the school and traveling in Mexico encouraging young people to come study.

The Bivens have served as teachers, counselors, E-TEAM hosts, gardeners, builders, tour guides and live-in grand-parents. There are nine

full time "boarding" students and 30 night students. At the current student body level it costs \$500 a week to cover all expenses.

The Gethsemani Children's Home was founded by the Bivens' son John and his wife Paulina after they had served 4 1/2 years in the Piedras Negras Children's home. They currently have 23 children and three elderly people. Their goal is to provide family style care for the children who come to them through the Department of Family. Currently two homes are open, two other houses are awaiting staff, a duplex for the elderly is being completed, and a 5th house will eventually be built. They have a large garden, cows, pigs, chickens and rabbits all for the table. They ask for prayer for wisdom in dealing with the children who arrive from homes of terrible abuse and neglect, and for workers, native Spanish speakers, who are truly called by the Lord to the ministry of loving and caring for children.






International Missions Board Votes to Restructure Funding System

Antioch, TN – In a historic act, the Board of International Missions voted unanimously this week to implement a new funding structure. This action is a result of more than two years of research, study, and planning.

“We are thrilled with this decision,” said board chairman Danny Williams. “Free Will Baptists are committed to the Great Commission and the way we fund our missionary effort is nothing more than a tool to help us reach people and plant churches. We believe the new plan will be a better tool than our current overburdened and complex system.”

“The most basic component of the new funding system,” according to General Director James Forlines, “is the Global Evangelism Fund.” This undesignated fund will be set up to underwrite the basic costs to keep every Free Will Baptist missionary on the field.

“No longer will we ask missionaries to travel all over the country to raise their own funds for their own accounts,” Director of Development Barry Simpson rejoiced. “Now, all of us will work together to help all of our called and approved missionaries get to, and stay on, their fields of service.”

Highlights of the plan include:

- An undesignated Global Evangelism Fund established to pay all the costs of keeping all missionaries on their fields.

- The Global Evangelism Fund will be underwritten by contributions to the World Missions Offering, church giving, and individual undesignated contributions.

- Every FWBIM missionary will also have a designated ministry and project fund to underwrite the cost of field ministry.

- Each missionary’s ministry and project fund will be underwritten by a limited number of strategic partner churches (or groups of churches).

- Any designated contributions to a missionary will be placed in the designated missionary’s ministry and project account.

- An annual analysis of ministry and project accounts will be conducted and reconciled as follows:

- Any deficit in underfunded accounts will be offset by funds transferred from the Global Evangelism Fund.

- Any surplus in overfunded accounts will be transferred into the Global Evangelism Fund.

- A Board-enforced limit on the percentage of income allocated to administrative expenditures.

- The plan will be implemented January 1, 2010.

- All designated funds received prior to implementation will be used as designated.

In advance of implementation of the new funding system, the IM board has directed the staff and missionaries to undertake a campaign to inform Free Will Baptist people of the details and implications of the new system.

“Our friends and supporters can expect to see information in receipt letters, in ONE Magazine, on the International Missions website and in special communications to pastors and churches,” explains Mark McPeak, director of communications.


